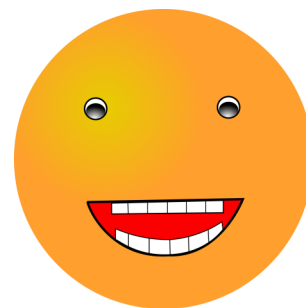

# Kibitzing on VuGraph...

To kibitz, go to [kibitz.realbridge.online](http://kibitz.realbridge.online). Select JLall Online Teams#7. You will be taken to a lobby where you will see a list of tables on the left and a chat box and list of people in the lobby on the right. The table listing shows the team & player names at each table. There will also be information about the number of kibitzers and whether there is audio/video commentary (a picture of a TV means there is).

At the table, you will see a hand diagram with the bidding and play as it happens.

There is a chat window on the right. You can type into that window.

If there is an asterisk next to a bid, that means it was Alerted or Explained. Click on the bid to see the explanation if there was one.

-- "Rewind" play using the slider underneath the table with the hand diagram.

-- Click on the "Scores" button to the left of the South player's name to get a scorecard for the match.

----Click on a board number to see the hand record and results at all of the tables.

----Click on a number in a yellow box to get to the hand record from some screens.

----In the hand record screen, click on a result to see the bidding and play at a specific table.

--In the upper left corner:

----Click on the yellow box with 4 little boxes to get the match scores for all the matches (that will be IMPs and for the Round Robin will not include scores from previous rounds).

----Click on the yellow box with 3 bulleted lines to get Cross-IMPs for the pairs (that will be just for this match).

The Scores information is also available in the lobby using the button at the upper right, in case you want to check on scores before deciding which table to watch.

## TIMING OF DEFERRAL

The Round Robin matches will be deferred until each round is completed.

The KO matches will be deferred for half an hour or until each board has been played at all tables, so there may sometimes be a period when nothing new is being shown because one or two tables are very slow to play the board.

### NOTES:

In accordance with the USBF General Conditions of Contest, each player must play at least one 8 board segment against each other team.

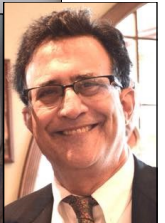
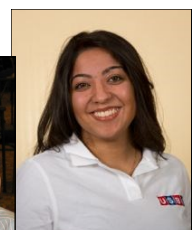
There are no seating rights - teams must submit their lineups before seeing their opponent's lineup.

In any case, once a diamond is led, declarer's problems are solved since there is only one play available in the spade suit and with the favorable lie of the spade suit, the play just works! The queen falls doubleton!

Two players led the S7 (third best.)

In Lall/Ge, Lall led the S7. Shi rose with the SA, cashed two high hearts, and played a small club off dummy to his nine and Lall's ace.

Lall had a problem. If he continues clubs, declarer will be able to ruff out Lall's partner's KJ, establishing the long club for a diamond or spade discard.

It seems that Lall's best play would be to exit with a spade, putting declarer to an immediate guess.

Instead, he chose to play a diamond, picking up his own queen ... and in the process, forcing declarer to drop his partner's SQ.

In Levine/Brod, like Lall, Wold led the S7.

Doub faced the same problem as Shi, but decided to play with the odds. The seven would be the normal lead from QT7, Q97, Q87, or T87... or maybe, T97.

Therefore, the opening leader has the queen more often than not.

Doub ducked at trick one and never had a chance to recover.

# French Onion Soup

**Recipe Cuisine:** French

**Recipe Category:** Soups, Stews, Chili

**Yield:** 4 Servings

**Prep Time = 0:00 Cook Time = 0:00 Total Time = 0:00**

### Ingredients:

- 2 tbsp Margarine
- 6 c Sliced Onion
- 1/2 tsp Minced Garlic
- 1 Bay Leaf
- 1 c White Wine
- 6 c Beef Stock
- 1 Sprig Fresh Thyme
- 6 Thick Slices Of French Bread, cut into rounds
- 1 c Shredded Swiss Cheese
- 1 c Shredded Parmesan Cheese



### Instructions:

- Heat margarine in large skillet; add onions, garlic and bay leaf. Cook over low heat stirring occasionally until onions are golden brown, about 45 minutes. Add 1/2 c wine; cook until wine is evaporated, stirring to loosen brown bits. Add remaining wine stock and thyme. Season with salt and pepper. Bring mixture to a boil. Reduce heat to low, simmer until onions are very tender, about 1 hour. Remove bay leaf and thyme sprig.
- 
- Heat oven to 200 degrees F. Bake bread rounds until dry; then remove.
- 
- Increase oven to 400 degrees F. Mix Swiss and Parmesan cheeses. Place equal amounts of onions in ovenproof soup bowls; fill bowls with soup. Place bread slice in each bowl, sprinkle with cheese mixture. Bake until cheese is golden brown and soup is hot, about 20 minutes. Serve.

## CARAMEL PRALINE CRÈME BRÛLÉE

### INGREDIENTS:

See all the accent marks? This is recipe going to be exotic. Okay, brûlée time!

- 20 egg yolks
- 3 oz brown sugar
- 2 oz sugar
- 4 cups heavy cream
- 4 cups half & half
- A taste of vanilla essence (or vanilla extract)

To make the caramel praline mix, this is all you need:

- ½ cup praline paste
- ½ cup caramel sauce

You can't caramelize without sugar! In this case, you'll need two types:

- 1 oz brown sugar
- 2 oz sugar

### INSTRUCTIONS

1. In a double boiler, mix the milk, the cream and 1 oz of sugar. Warm this mixture.
2. Mix the egg yolk with the other half amount of sugar.
3. Combine the milk and egg yolk mixture. Add vanilla extract.
4. Add the caramel praline mix and strain it... twice, for good measure.
5. Taste before pouring it into the brûlée dish
6. Bake in a water bath at 340° F for 20 to 30 minutes.
7. Mix the sugar and brown sugar.
8. Generously sprinkle the brûlée with the sugar mix and caramelize the surface under a very hot broiler, or use a propane or butane cooking torch. (Careful with the torch!)
9. **Fancy bonus!** Garnish with fruit, mint leaf... or whatever you'd like!

# LECHE FLAN

## INGREDIENTS:

- 1 cup sugar
- ½ cup sugar (keep this one separate)
- 6 eggs, large (at room temperature)
- 14 oz sweetened condensed milk
- 26 oz evaporated milk
- 1 tsp vanilla extract
- 1 pinch salt
- 1 8-inch baking dish
- 1 baking tray with high sides
- Mixer



## HERE'S HOW YOU DO IT:

1. Everybody needs a warm-up. Preheat the oven to 325° F and maybe do a few light stretches.
2. Pour one cup of sugar into a warm, dry pan over medium heat. Constantly stir the sugar. Soon it will turn a deep golden color and caramelize.
3. Quickly pour the liquid sugar into the baking dish. It should cover the entire base of the baking dish before it cools.
4. Break the eggs and combine them together in a mixer until they look frothy and well-mixed.
5. Keep mixing the eggs, but now slowly pour in the condensed milk. Keep mixing as you add the evaporated milk. Then slowly mix in the vanilla and the remaining sugar (a half-cup).
6. Pour the mixture, which should be custard-like, into your caramel-lined baking dish. Place the baking dish on the baking tray.
7. Using an oven mitt, pull out the oven rack and place the tray on the rack and the dish on the tray. Fill the baking tray with about an inch of hot water, so that the baking dish is surrounded with water, but not floating. Push the tray back into the oven and close the door.
8. Bake the flan for 45 minutes and check with a knife, just to the side of the center. If the knife comes out clean, it's ready. If not, give it a few more minutes to cook.
9. Once it's done, remove the flan from the oven and let it cool in the baking tray. Once it reaches room temperature, place the whole baking dish in the refrigerator — overnight if you can, but for at least one hour.
10. When you're ready to serve, place a serving dish over the flan and turn the whole thing over so that the flan falls onto the serving dish. The caramel sauce will flow over the top of the custard.
11. Enjoy immediately and completely. You can refrigerate the leftovers for up to 48 hours... but why would you have leftovers?

On Board 52, timing is everything. Kolesnik led the S6 and Hessel inserted the ST from dummy, covered by the queen and king. Hessel attacked his long suit immediately, leading a diamond to the ace and finessed for the DQ. Kolesnik won his queen and cleared the spades.

Hessel won the spade, cashed the DK and led a club toward dummy. Kolesnik won the CA and cashed three spades... contract down two!

At the other table, Clayton led the S6 to the ten, queen and king.

Rigal had a little extra information... since Clayton had overcalled 1S on what

appeared to be Jxxxx. It was likely that Clayton held the CA since he lacked so much in spades. Rather than tackling diamonds immediately, Rigal led a small club toward dummy. Clayton ducked the ace and Rigal played on diamonds, establishing four diamond tricks, two heart tricks, two spade tricks, and a club for nine!

If Clayton had won his CA and cleared spades, Rigal would be able to duck a diamond into Sprung's hand, leaving Sprung with no exit.

Rigal would have two hearts, two spades and two clubs and would only need three tricks in diamonds. 13 IMP to Lo

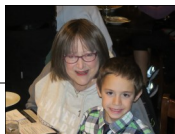

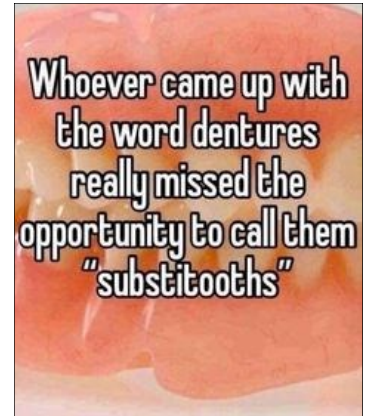

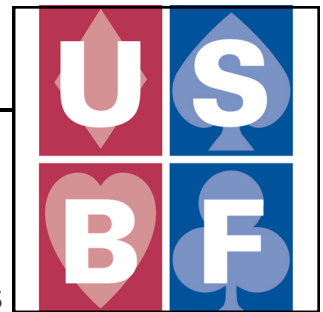

# Logic Riddle...

Three passengers are sitting in a train car with the window open as they travel cross-country. Suddenly a freight locomotive laden with coal speeds by, knocking a cloud of soot straight into the passenger car's window. All three passengers' faces are covered in soot, but it happens so rapidly that none realize their own face is covered. When Miss Atkinson looks up from her book, she begins to laugh at how absurd the other two passengers look, who are also laughing.

Each passenger assumes that their own face is clean, and that the other two are laughing at each other. Then Miss Atkinson suddenly stops laughing and takes a handkerchief out of her purse to wipe her face clean.

How did she know she also had soot on her face?

**Hint:** In this puzzle, we can assume that all of the passengers are making logical assumptions, but Miss Atkinson is a bit quicker than her carriage companions.

## Solution:

Miss Atkinson knows that she has soot on her face because neither of the other two passengers stops laughing, or realizes their faces are sooty. If only two people had sooty faces, then they would see everyone laughing, one sooty face, and one clean face. Because the others are also laughing, they would know that their own face was sooty—if only two people had mucky faces.

Since neither of the other two realize their own face is dirty, Miss Atkinson realizes that her own must be as well, which would allow the other two passengers to believe their own faces clean and continue laughing.

Make sure to give this one to your fellow train car companions down the line, and make sure to come back for another riddle!
